## LIFE IN COLONIES

Life on a Farm	-9/10 Col. lived -Everyone pitched in to build houses -Chores = making cloth, furniture
Life in Cities	-1/20 Col. Lived -Blacksmith shops, taverns, churches, garbage all of city, mosquitos & flies
Rights of Colonists	-American citizens saw themselves as English Citizens and expected the same rights as citizens in England More rights to citizens b/c of: 1215-Magna Carta limited king's power & says he must follow law 1265-Parliament = group of lawmakers created to approve laws -1689-English Bill of Rights guarantees rights as trial by jury, petitioning king, choosing representatives to create taxes
Life for African Americans	-Slavery in all 3 regions but mostly in South (crops/plantations) -Little hope of making a better life b/c their life was fixed at the bottom of society
	-Horns & drums called people to worship w/ assigned seats -Houses searched to make sure everyone went to church -services = 5 hours and after lunch returned to church The Great AwakeningB/C people were less religious the G.A. began -idea that "God sees all as equals" spreads -Principles of liberty, equality and resisting unjust authority grow stronger
	-N.E 50 families + hired a teacher Towns w/ 100 fam. built school Why? To read bible (Puritan) Few supplies; Single room -Middle ColEvery rel. group decided whether or not to build a school Southern Col A few neighbors hire a tutor

Colonial Families	-Indentured Servants could not marry -people married in early 20s -Married within Social Class Families used "all hands on deck" philosophy = any relative and took care of elders
Leisure	-Bee was an event to combine work and play -Activities included playing cards, horse racing, wrestling, dance contents, billiards
