

- This country was our ally during the war, but they didn't join until our victory at Saratoga proved we had a good chance to win.
- By 1777, Washington wanted to fight this type of war, one in which he would only fight when attacked and do everything he could to tire out the British forces.
- This was a guerrilla fighting tactic used by Americans in the South to tire out the British.
- This town was the site of the battle where Washington and his army defeated groggy Hessians on the day after Christmas, 1776.
- The Americans almost never had enough of these, which included uniforms, ammo, weapons, food, etc.
- This was the site of another American victory, just a few days after the victory at Trenton, and proved to the Americans that they could win the war after all
- This man's outstanding leadership was one of the greatest strengths of the Continental Army.
- Also known as the Swamp Fox, this ancestor of Mrs. Kasper made life very difficult for the British in the South.
- The British shifted the war to this part of the country once they felt they could no longer control New England and the Middle Colonies.
